

As most of you know, I retired at the end of May after thirty years of teaching. Of course I plan to get in a lot more birding now! This also is my last "Call Notes" since we will be electing a new slate of officers at the Fall Meeting. Marion Schiefer and her Nominating Committee have worked diligently to find nominees to present for election.

This past April our Vice-President, Terri Jacobson, and our Secretary, Elsie Croft, had to resign their posts due to other commitments. We appreciate their service to MOS.

Several MOS'ers jumped at the opportunity to visit Strawberry Plains on April 29 to meet and bird with David Sibley. We all were so thrilled and honored just to be in his presence.

On our way to Glacier National Park in June we stopped in Phillips Co., eastern Montana, to meet with Stephen Dinsmore and his intern to observe his work with the Mountain Plovers and to try for a Sprague's Pipit, which would be a life bird for me. The weather was very uncooperative but we did manage to see a Plover, nest, and eggs. The territory and the work that they do with the Mountain Plovers is both challenging and rewarding. Thanks to Stephen I not only got to hear the Sprague's Pipit's cascading whistles, but also had a great view of one on the ground despite rain on my eyeglasses and my binoculars and wading in sloshy mud!

We look forward to hopefully seeing many of you in Starkville for the Fall Meeting.

STEPHEN J. DINSMORE TO SPEAK AT FALL MEETING

Stephen Dinsmore, who is presently an Avian Population Ecologist and Assistant Professor in the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries at Mississippi State University, will be speaking at the banquet of the Fall Meeting to be held at Starkville. His subject will be "Shorebirds: Their Natural History and Conservation in North America." His talk will focus on two of the species he has worked with extensively, Sanderling and Mountain Plover. He will also be showing slides of many other shorebirds that he has photographed over the past several years and discussing the recent North American Shorebird Conservation Plan.

Stephen came to Mississippi last fall after having spent four years in Montana working as Wildlife/Range Technician for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, where he continued his study of the demography of Mountain Plovers. He received his Ph.D. in Fishery and Wildlife Biology at Colorado State University in December, 2001, after writing his dissertation on "Population biology of Mountain Plovers in southern Phillips County, Montana."

Stephen has been interested in birds since he was about 8 years old when his father, who was then an ornithologist at the University of Tampa in Florida, enlisted him to help survey and band colonial waterbirds in and around Tampa Bay. He says he still has a particular fondness for waterbirds, especially shorebirds, gulls, and terns. He has traveled widely throughout the United States and abroad, mainly out of a desire to learn more about bird identification and distribution. Mississippi was one of the states that he had not spent much time in before he moved here last fall. He has been spending much of his free time since he arrived getting familiar with different birding areas and is consistently adding to the bird records for the state. We welcome him to Mississippi and to MOS and look forward to hearing his presentation at the fall meeting.

FALL MEETING - OCTOBER 4-6, 2002 STARKVILLE/NOXUBEE NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE

The fall meeting is being hosted by the Oktibbeha Audubon Society and MOS members in the Starkville-Columbus area.
