

President's Corner By Carl Smith MOS President

I wish to dedicate this article to two important members of MOS, Stephen Dinsmore and Jenny Thompson. At press time Stephen is undertaking his new job at Iowa State University and Jenny is back in her home state of Virginia.

Stephen has been a tremendous asset to MOS and we will all miss him. He is responsible for creating and maintaining our Website. He has contributed numerous photographs to the site and has added prolifically to the archive of rare bird sightings for the state. Stephen's move will be our loss and on behalf of everyone, I wish him much prosperity in his future.

Jenny, MOS Secretary, has been a very active member on our Mississippi Birding Festival Committee. Thank you for your contributions Jenny. We wish you well in your future and we'll miss you.

Our speaker for Friday evening will be Dr. Clinton W. Jeske. Clint received his Ph.D. in 1991 from Colorado State University. His research has focused on behavioral and physiological ecology of wintering waterfowl. Current studies are attempting to determine environmental cues used by Northern Pintails to assess remote habitat availability prior to initiation of long-distance movements; waterbird use of hypersaline wetlands in New Mexico and avian osmoregulatory ability when exposed to hypersaline habitats; measuring stress in Lesser Snow Geese; determining the role of metabolic limitations in observed winter distribution patterns; and determination of normal baselines for hematological parameters.

Dr. Jeske contributed to the Spring 2001 U. S. Geological Survey, National Wetlands Research Center, Final Report to the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The report determined from aerial surveys the distribution, species, composition, and numbers of wading bird and seabird colonies in Louisiana.

Clint will teach field marks for wading birds at our Friday gathering. We look forward to taking this information into the field on Saturday.

RECAP OF THE FEBRUARY 2005 MEETING By Jenny Thompson, Secretary

The 2005 MOS February meeting was held February 11-13 at Tara Wildlife, Inc. in Warren County Mississippi. The Tara Wildlife staff kicked off the meeting by giving out door prizes. The grand prize was a copy of Jerry Jackson's book that went to Ned Boyajian.

Saturday dawned with displaying American Woodcocks in a field near the main lodge. After breakfast members went on one of 4 field trips: Mahannah Wildlife Management Area and Eagle Lake led by Gene Knight; a levee trip led by Scott Somershoe; Halpino Lake and the Bald Eagle nest led by Mr. Wade Creekmore; and Australia Island led by Bruce Reid. Everyone reconvened at the lodge for lunch and then went back out for more birding and socialization.

On Saturday evening we had our banquet and annual business meeting. The meeting was called to order by President Carl Smith. The minutes of the Fall 2004 meeting were accepted as published in the spring newsletter. The treasurer's report was given by Jan Dubuisson and the report was accepted as read.

Carl acknowledged attendance of four of the original MOS members: Ed Alexander, Jerry Jackson, Joe McGee, and Judy Toups. He also recognized our four newest members: Berlin Heck Jr., Berlin Heck III, Charlie Heck, and Kay Shipp.

It was announced that the Fall 2005 meeting will be held sometime in August in Natchez and that the Birding Festival idea is still alive and in committee.

Gene Knight conducted the species count for Friday and Saturday, which came to 106.

After the business meeting, Judy Toups introduced the speaker, Dr. Jerome (Jerry) Jackson. Jerry was formerly a Professor at the Department of Biological Science at Mississippi State University and one of the original members of MOS. The program entitled IN SEARCH OF THE IVORY-BILLED WOODPECKER, featured Jerry's new book from Smithsonian Press Books, 2004. Following the program, Jerry signed books and answered questions and the meeting was adjourned.

Sunday morning members went their separate ways. Several folks convened in Vicksburg to view the Lesser Goldfinch, which brought the species tally to 107 for the weekend.

FALL MEETING AUGUST 19-21, 2005 ST. CATHERINE CREEK NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE

The 2005 MOS Fall Meeting will be August 19, 20, and 21 at St. Catherine Creek National Wildlife Refuge near Natchez, Mississippi. Once again the scheduled picnic and Saturday night field trip to see thousands of Wood Storks return to the refuge at dusk promises a thrilling and unusual "twist" to the "after-dinner speaker" routine of past meetings!

Our Friday night gathering will be at the Natchez Convention Center, in downtown Natchez, (bounded by Main, Canal, Walls, and Franklin Streets) from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. There will be a short time of visiting and then a wading bird identification presentation by Dr. Clinton Jeske. Please eat before or after the program, as food and drink will not be served.

Saturday morning will be birding at the refuge with field trip leaders. You will be on your own for lunch and afternoon birding. Then we will have a casual picnic, compilation of birds, and a short business meeting at the Grand Village of the Natchez Indians located at the end of Jeff Davis Blvd. off U.S. Hwy 61 near the Days Inn. Grand Village is administered by the Mississippi Dept. of Archives & History and has a pleasant little park with a nature trail about a mile long, which runs along a little creek and can provide some good birding.

Bring your CHAIR for the picnic as well as the rest of the day on the levees of the refuge. Bring hat, sunscreen, bug repellent and PLENTY of food and drinks to sustain you during the HOT day!

Registration: Please fill out the registration form on the last page and mail it, along with your fees, to Jan Dubuisson in time to reach her no later than **August 12.** The caterer for the picnic has a **DEFINITE DEADLINE!**

ACCOMODATIONS: A block of rooms under the name MOS have been reserved at the Days INN, 109 Hwy 61 South in Natchez. Phone # 601-445-8291. Rates are \$55.00 per night and continental breakfast is available from 6-10 a.m.

DIRECTIONS TO THE NATCHEZ CONVENTION CENTER- For those traveling on U.S. 61 and who are unfamiliar with Natchez, the simplest route is to go west onto U.S. 84 toward the Mississippi River Bridge, turn right onto S. Canal, just before the Visitor Center (where we met last time) and proceed to Main Street which is one-way west, toward the river. Parking is available in front of the Convention Center, or you can take a right at the next corner, Franklin Street, a right on Wall Street and another right onto Main if you wish. If one is coming down the Natchez Trace, which now reaches the city limits, go to the end of the Trace, then take Liberty Road west toward downtown which will run into John Quitman Parkway which, in turn, will become Main Street. The Convention Center will be six blocks away.
